Matter related to grant of permission to the Bapuji Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bapuji Campus, T R Nagara, Challakere, Chitradurga, Karnataka to increase the admission capacity from 40 to 60 seats in existing UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2015-16 under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 - reg.

Sir,

In continuation to the Ministry's letter of even No. dated 08.01.2015 wherein a Letter of Intent was issued to the college with respect to the proposal submitted to the Central Government, I am directed to say that after careful consideration of the recommendations of the CCIM and observations of the Hearing Committee based on submission made by the college during hearing in terms of the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant regulations made thereunder and approved norms for academic session 2015-16, which were circulated vide Ministry's letter No.R.11011/01/2015-EP (IM-1) dated 05.05.2015 (available on Ministry's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>); permission of the Central Government is hereby granted to the Bapuji Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bapuji Campus, T R Nagara, Challakere, Chitradurga, Karnataka to increase the admission capacity from 40 to 60 seats (20 additional seats) in existing UG (BAMS) course, from the academic session 2015-16 under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970. The college has already been granted permission for 40 UG seats vide the then Department's letter No.R.17011/54/2014-EP (IM-1) dated 06.08.2014 for a period not exceeding five years from the academic session 2014-15 to the academic session 2018-19, therefore, the college may take admission for 20 additional UG seats as mentioned above from the academic session 2015-16 to the academic session 2018-19.

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- 2. This permission to increase admission capacity in existing UG course as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2015-16 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these increased UG seats mentioned above appear for the first final examination of the said course and at that time, the College Authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications of students admitted against the increased seats under Section 14 (2) of the IMCC Act, 1970.
  - 3. The college administration will ensure sufficient qualified teachers, as prescribed in the relevant CCIM Regulations are in position before the admission of the students in the above-mentioned increased UG (BAMS) seats is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.
  - 4. Further, to obtain permission for the academic session 2019-20 onwards and to take admissions in the above said increased intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course shall maintain all the requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirement of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospital) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder in toto during the period of permission (i.e. up to 2018-19) as intimated by the then Department's vide letter No.R.17011/54/2014-EP (IM-1) dated 06.08.2014, which may be verified either by the Central Government or by the Central Council of Indian Medicine on receipt of any complaint. Further, as per the provisions of Sub-Regulation (2) of Regulation 3 of the MSR Regulations, 2012, the Central Council shall visit the college suo moto three months before the expiry of permission to verify the requisite infrastructure and facilities required under above mentioned regulations by means of an inspection and shall submit a report to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2019-20.
